COUNSELLOR'S CORNER WITH MISS SEREDA Preparing Your Child for Transitions

Our children experience so many different transitions. Perhaps they are making the big jump from kindergarten to first grade soon, switching teachers/classmates or moving from the sixth grade to a new school. Regardless of the transition, there are many ways that we can support children to prepare for change in a healthy way. As the school year nears its end, think about these ideas to help transition your child through the summer to a new school year:



- Talk about the positives of entering a new grade: new teacher(s), new friends, and new opportunities.
- Address your child's fears. Listen to and validate these fears and don't ignore or tell them to 'get over it'. Let them know that being fearful or worried is normal and most people feel these things before a change.
- Begin preparations early. Start setting bedtime routines in summer earlier to help prepare for the transition back to school.
- A great way to prepare your child for their upcoming year is to build excitement about the topics they will learn and provide them with fun, relevant experiences to build on. Here are some summer activity ideas to inspire you:

- **-Kindergarten** students will begin to practice letters in Early Literacy. Teach them a letter and have them search for that letter on a walk or roadtrip ("Let's see how many A's we can spy!"). One Smartie or Skittle per letter they find can be a great motivator!
- -Grade 1 students will learn to look for geometric shapes in their surroundings in Math. Go for a walk in your community and have your child look for and snap pictures of a specific shape (Ex: see how many triangles they can find).
- -Grade 2 students learn about water properties (floating/sinking) in Science. Take your child out to a local stream or river and see who can make the best mini-boat to float down the river.
- -Grade 3 students learn about different countries in Social Studies, including Ukraine. Consider taking your child on a day trip to the nearby Ukrainian Cultural Village.
- -Grade 4 students learn about stories and perspective in English Language Arts. Tell stories around the campfire with your family.
- -Grade 5 students will learn about weather systems in Science. Take a blanket to your backyard and try to spot different cloud types and shapes.
- **-Grade 6** students learn about the Alberta provincial government in Social Studies. Take a free day trip to the Legislature and watch the 4-D movie in the Pehonan Theatre.
- **-Grade 7** students will learn how to add and subtract fractions. Pick out a baking recipe together and then have them figure out how to double it. Fractions never tasted so yummy!



Kindergarten News

The Kindergarten students had fun learning about Spring last month, even though we did not have much Spring-like weather. It is nice to be back to the warmer weather again. Our classroom gets very hot when it is warm outside so you might want to dress your children in layers that they can take off even if it is a bit cool outside. That way they can still wear a t-shirt or tank top in the classroom during the day.

This month's theme is Transportation. The children are thrilled to begin our new theme and I already know the airport and train station are the most popular. We will continue to practice letters and numbers as well as beginning reading and Math skills.

Unfortunately, we cannot have siblings come along with the parents for either of those days. Grandparents, Aunts or Uncles are welcome to volunteer if the parents are unable to attend. Grade 1 News

April showers bring May flowers! And true to that saying, April was full of showers/snow and now I have flowers poking up through the earth to shine their colorful faces to the sun! Hopefully the warm weather will stay so we can enjoy being outdoors and stay dry while doing so. On that note, please make sure that your child has a complete extra set of clothes in their locker. We had many puddle incidents last month and many students who didn't have a change of clothes.

This month in language arts we will be looking at diphthongs like au/aw, ou/ow and oi/oy. We will continue our weekly Literacy Centres where we practice our phonics sounds, explore making words, write in our journals and read to ourselves, listen to reading and read with the teacher. Please continue to do daily home reading as we head into the home stretch of this school year. Nightly practice of our weekly spelling words is also encouraged. In math, we will finish our current unit, Adding and Subtracting to 20, and start our Measurement unit. In Science, we will continue studying plants and then compare them with animals. What do they both need to survive? We will also pick and animal to focus on as a class, and hopefully start individual reports about an animal of our choosing by the end of the month. In Social we will begin our last unit "Moving Forward with the Past: My Family, My History and My Community". In health we will be wrapping up Roots of Empathy. In gym, we will play tag games and parachute games.

Grade 2 News

What's the Scoop this Month?

It is an expectation in grade 2 that students are reading for 15 minutes, each night. I encourage students to choose a variety of reading materials, ranging from short chapter books, levelled books, graphic novels & magazines. Home reading is important because it helps develop fluency, accuracy, and comprehension in all of our subjects. Begin

asking your child higher level comprehension questions. Some questions could include: What does this story remind you of? What is the problem in the chapter/story? How is it solved? What is the main idea in the story? Can you predict what might happen next?



Reading takes you places, and opens your imagination...

For the month of May, students will be introduced to adding/subtracting of two digit numbers. Your child should be able to answer single digit adding/subtracting questions with ease. If this is still challenging for them, please assist your child by asking them to tell their mental math strategy. You can play dice games, practice oral questions in the car or try some addition and subtraction games on the computer. Practicing these strategies are very important as the students will be applying that knowledge when adding and subtracting two digit numbers.

Now, as we have very few days left in grade 3, we plan on being super busy in class with hopes of heading outside for some fun and sun when our work is done. In language arts, the Grade 3's are excited to begin the novel study, *Fantastic Mr. Fox*, by Roald Dahl. It is the story of Mr. Fox and his wild ways of hen heckling, turkey taking, and cider sipping

instinctive adventures. When our study is completed, the Grade 3's will be able to view the movie in class and find the similarities and differences between the book and movie. - Social: We are continuing to learn about how treaties in Alberta were created, why they were made, and their impact.


