4. Principal Report - Paul McKay

It has been a while since we have met and so many things have happened it will be hard to capture it all in this report. In a world full of change it sure has been like drinking from a firehose. Since we last spoke all school mandates have been lifted as the province tries to move things forward. The school is no different, there was a definite excitement in the building when we returned from family day weekend and it sure was nice to see the kids' faces. What I am most excited about is that a few of our students continue to wear masks as well as some of our teachers now and we have not had one single complaint about teasing or feeling left out. The changes can fast and as a staff we have yet to have time to sit down and discuss what our next steps will be now that restrictions have been lifted. The desire to hit the ground running will be high, but we need to be conscientious that not everyone is ready to dive right in. At the staff meeting this week we will discuss things like assemblies, parent teacher interviews, and field trips. Once we decide on a path that works for everyone we will communicate that to our community. Speaking of interviews, report cards are due out on Friday March 18th and interviews are scheduled for the following week. Stay tuned for more information.

February was a month that we asked Bruderheim families to state their intentions for next year and fill out the returning student registration forms. Those have all been collected and at this time enrollment is down a bit. Historically, Bruderheim is always a little low at this time of year especially in kindergarten. We currently have 9 kids enrolled in Kindergarten and are hoping for

more. By our next council meeting I hope to have a more detailed picture of what the 2022-23 year will look like. One of the things we are considering is what it would mean to our school population to have a before and after school care run by the school. I am hearing that childcare is a challenge in our small community. This may be some of the reasons families are choosing to leave to keep siblings together on the bus and make sure that they come and go at the same time. I am planning to send out a survey to garner the interest in such a program before I proceed.

March is an exciting month when it comes to school council and the new playground. Offers are out for tender and a meeting is scheduled for March 8 to review designs. I am looking for one member of our council to attend this meeting with us. If you are interested, please let me know. It is tentatively scheduled for 8am but I think that it will be later once it has been officially scheduled. I will provide the link for the meeting once I get it.
