### 4. Principal Report - Paul McKay

Good evening everyone. It feels like it has been a while since we met. It is nice to see everyone again. The last month and a bit has been incredibly busy. We observed Remembrance Day, had report cards, held parent teacher interviews and many other activities throughout the month. We managed to collect over 40lbs of Candy to donate to the food bank, over 100 pairs of mittens to support the bissel center and we are just about to finish up our food bank collection for the holiday season. Our little school sure has done a great job to support our community and I am so proud of them.

Other important initiatives that are in the works at our school include the learning disruption funding provided by the Alberta government. Our school received close to 11 000 dollars in funding to support a select group of grade 2-3 students who fall below the 25th %ile in literacy and numeracy. Ms. Hoekman has been hired and will begin on January 5 and work every day with these students until the end of March. We are anticipating another injection of money to support our struggling grade 1 learners early in 2022.

As well in early 2022, I will be sending out a copy of our projected fees for next year. Once they are put together parents will have an opportunity to provide feedback or attend our next parent council meeting to discuss. Once parents have had time to provide feedback, I will establish the fees for 2022 and send those to our division office to approve.

The Christmas concert was amazing, and I cannot wait for you to see it. The link will be sent out to parents this Friday and we will watch it as a school this Friday as well. Fingers crossed that this is the last virtual concert.

# 5. Trustee Report - Colleen Holowaychuk

- ASBA Fall General Meeting was held Nov 14-16, 2021. I was sworn in as a Director on the Provincial ASBA Board of Directors.
- Minister attended, she said they are taking all of the feedback for the curriculum and we could see something very different from the draft that was originally released. Of course this is nothing for sure and we won't know until they release a second draft in spring 2022.
- Eips nominated Dow Chemical for the Asba Friends of Education Award. They were a Zone 2/3 Winner.
- November 25, 2021 Board Meeting
- Approved the unaudited accumulated surplus at August 31, 2021. Eips ended the year with an operating surplus 2021 of \$6.11 million, and an overall accumulated surplus of \$24.37 million.
- 2020-2021 Audited Financial Statements, Eips received a clean audit.
- Annual Education Results Report has been approved.
- The board approved the 2021-22 Fall Budget. The 2021-2022 operating budget is \$198.26 million, which includes drawing \$5.38 million from reserves.
- November 24-30, 2021 School Assurance Reviews, schools shared their greatest strengths, challenges and opportunities for growth with the Board of Trustees and senior Administration.
- Dec 6-7 Board Retreat in Camrose
- December 13, 2021 Minister announced some changes to curriculum and the roll out of only certain subjects to take place in fall 2022. Senior administration will be working on next steps of how it will affect our students and staff.
