### 4. Trustee Report - Colleen Holowaychuk

The Board has several budget working days scheduled. Spending time reviewing our vision and priorities as we work through the budget discussions with administration.

We did get our funding envelope as promised on March 31, 2021.

Allocations to schools will be approved at the April 22, 2021 board meeting. We will also be approving the system administration fees at this meeting.

We continue to regularly review Covid response and recovery within the division. The board held a special meeting where we approved 3 full time FSLWs to connect with students between April and June. We have some students who have not been connecting with schools regularly and we want to ensure they are ready for the 2021-22 school year. We also updated our division modular request to the government at this meeting.

The board has decided not to implement a technology fee next year. Instead the division's technology plan is to be updated and more information will come forward when it is ready.

New curriculum is the big news. Our board knew that we would not be piloting the curriculum a while ago. It is an operational decision and Superintendent Liguori feels that students have already had two school years of disrupted learning and

doesn't feel the time is right to add anything else. Our administration is reviewing the draft curriculum and we are asking parents to review and do the survey to provide their feedback to Alberta Education.

April is always the time of year when we thank our volunteers and even though it has been a very different year in terms of volunteering, we still want to say thank you to those that go out of their way to enhance our students' school experience. Reminder that the online virtual ASCA conference is April 23-25, 2021.

# 5. Principal Report - Cheryl Semeniuk

**Playground Replacement -** Great news. Friends of Bruderheim School have received \$125,000 in provincial grant money towards replacing our playground. The Town of Bruderheim is contributing \$100,000. Our community has raised the difference to allow us to purchase a playground up to \$250,000. The process involved includes:

- Stakeholder input on top 5 wishes for the playground (slides, climbing apparatus, swings, design) The Town of Bruderheim's preference is to match the primary colours already in place at the newer playground on the school site. This input is due to EIPS on April 28. Input process in development.
- 2. A cheque presentation will occur to the EIPS Board of Trustees from the Town of Bruderheim / MLA for the grant money.
- 3. Tender Process the tender must be open for a month, followed by a small committee from EIPS facilities, Town of Bruderheim staff, school principal to go through tenders and select a winning bidder.
- 4. The project proceeds with ordering, site preparation, construction, inspections. The project can take up to 18 months.
- 5. Grand opening celebration when ready.
