5. Business Arising from the Minutes

o Stove Purchase

The new stove has been purchased, and staff are pleased with it. Once additional cheques have been ordered, we will reimburse the school for the cost of \$1,055.

Swimming Lesson Subsidies

The total bus cost for swimming lessons was \$1,890. The Town Council is generously donating approximately \$1,400 toward this expense, which Andy will collect and transfer to the treasurers.

o Pancake Breakfast

The Pancake Breakfast on November 4, 2024, was a hit! The Fire Department expressed interest in making this an annual event, and Parent Council is enthusiastic about this idea. Students are creating thank-you cards for both the Fire Department and the Lions Club. Parent Council will also send a thank-you card. Total expenses for forks, spoons, and plates were \$61.38, while all other supplies and food were donated by the Fire Department and Lions Club.
